II. Policing Action

A. CPOP

3. Olden Tot Lot: Tom Otten and Linda Ackerman reported to the group that Duke has put up additional lights on their property overlooking the Tot Lot. We are still working with Cincinnati Rec. to have them put up additional lighting as well. Prior to establishing lighting we will have to send a petition around to all the adjacent neighbors, so they can agree to the change.
